



Family Fun Weekend

Moses' life is filled with dramatic and symbolic moments that can be easily adapted into lessons or activities for children this Adventurer Year. Each of these aspects offers opportunities for hands-on activities like crafts, plays, songs, or interactive lessons that make the life of Moses relatable and memorable for children. Be ready to share with us all you learn this year.

<p>Baby in the Basket</p>	<p>Story: When baby Moses is hidden in a basket to save him from Pharaoh's decree, and placed in the Nile River, where Pharaoh's daughter finds him.</p> <p>Representation: A craft where kids make baskets or dramatize this scene is simple and engaging.</p>
<p>The Burning Bush</p>	<p>Story: God speaks to Moses from a burning bush that is not consumed by the flames, calling him to lead the Israelites out of Egypt.</p> <p>Representation: Use crafts to simulate a "burning bush" using tissue paper or LED lights to illustrate the miraculous nature of the event.</p>
<p>Moses and the Ten Plagues (select 1 of the 10 plagues)</p>	<p>Story: Moses calls down ten plagues on Egypt when Pharaoh refuses to let the Israelites go. Multiple Clubs (10)</p> <p>Representation: Children can learn about the plagues with simple storytelling or skits and create drawings or crafts that illustrate each plague.</p>
<p>Parting of the Red Sea-Corinth "Little Lights"</p>	<p>Story: Moses parts the Red Sea so the Israelites can escape from Pharaoh's army.</p> <p>Representation: Kids can use blue fabric or paper to show the parting of the sea, or dramatize walking through it in a play.</p>
<p>Receiving the Ten Commandments</p>	<p>Story: Moses receives the Ten Commandments from God on Mount Sinai.</p> <p>Representation: Kids can create their own tablets with the commandments or role-play Moses on the mountain receiving God's law.</p>
<p>Moses Striking the Rock for Water</p>	<p>Story: Moses strikes a rock in the wilderness, and water comes out to quench the Israelites' thirst.</p> <p>Representation: A simple craft can show the rock and water, or act out the event play.</p>

<p>Manna from Heaven</p>	<p>Story: God provides manna from heaven to feed the Israelites in the wilderness.</p> <p>Representation: Kids can do a cooking activity where they "make" manna or learn about God's provision with simple object lessons.</p>
<p>Moses' Staff and Miracles</p>	<p>Story: Moses uses his staff for miracles, such as turning it into a serpent or parting the Red Sea.</p> <p>Representation: Kids can make their own "staves" out of cardboard or paper to represent Moses' authority given by God.</p>
<p>The Golden Calf Incident</p>	<p>Story: While Moses is on Mount Sinai, the Israelites create and worship a golden calf, breaking God's commandments.</p> <p>Representation: This can be used as a lesson in obedience and idolatry, with kids creating golden calf crafts or engaging in discussions.</p>
<p>Moses' Leadership and Guiding the Israelites</p>	<p>Story: Throughout his life, Moses leads the Israelites with God's guidance, through hardships and challenges.</p> <p>Representation: Role-playing games or leadership activities to help kids understand teamwork and faith.</p>
<p>The Tabernacle</p>	<p>Story: Moses leads the construction of the tabernacle, where God's presence will dwell among the people.</p> <p>Representation: A model or drawing activity can illustrate the Tabernacle, teaching kids about worship and God's holiness.</p>
